BIG IDEA: Some more annoyingly practical advice for life.

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READ: Proverbs 30:1-33

THINK: Review these "lists to live by", and then ask yourself these questions: In what ways are "the sayings of Agur" similar and distinct from the proverbs of Solomon we've studied so far? What is the point of the literary technique of comparing 3 or 4 items with one another? What do you learn about Agur from the opening verses (v1-9)? What makes the generations of v11-14 "fools" as Proverbs defines the term? How are these "generations" different from Agur? What does it mean for the four items mentioned v15-17 to insatiably leech off others? What is "wondrous" and amazing about the "mysteries" mentioned in v18-19? Why the contrast of v20 to v18-19? What is "intolerable" about the next four things in v21-23? What is so "wise" about the four small creatures (v24-28)? What is "stately" about the final four things mentioned in v29-31? How do v32-33 serve as a summary and conclusion to the rest of the chapter?

DO: How does this passage confront and challenge our tendencies toward the SELF-LIFE? What are the top three life skills you intend to immediately pursue and develop as you seek to master THE ART OF LIVING?
